

Bloodborne Pathogens for Healthcare Workers Course Outline-Outline

Overview:

Bloodborne pathogens (BBP) are disease-causing microorganisms present in human blood, tissues, and organs. Three common BBP's are human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), hepatitis B virus (HBV), and hepatitis C virus (HCV). This course discusses how BBP come in contact with Healthcare workers and techniques to minimize contact. Also discussed are housekeeping issues and clean up related to wastes contaminated with potentially infectious material.
